#### **Causative Verbs Have Get Something**

MAKE - GET - HAVE - HELP - LET The verbs 'make', 'get', 'have', 'help' and 'let' are the most common causative verbs in English. They are called causative verbs because they cause something else to happen. Other causative verbs include : enable, allow, keep, hold, force, require, persuade.

The causatives are the verbs that are used to indicate that one person causes another person to do something for the first person. One can cause somebody to do something for him/her by asking, paying, requesting, or forcing the person.
